ENTRY CONDITIONS

Competitors must be amateur gardeners. Children may take part in an adult class as long as long as the entry is their own work.

COMPETITORS ARE ALLOWED TWO ENTRIES PER CLASS (exc photographs)

There is a 20p charge per entry. Age must be stated for all children's classes.

Entries may be presented from 9.00 am to 11.30 am on show day. All staging must be completed by 12 noon.

Prizes will be presented at 3.30 pm and exhibits may be removed at 3.45pm. Any remaining on the tables after 4.00 pm will be sold in aid of the Village Hall funds. The show will finish with the raffle draw.

Judging of classes 1-40 will be based on the Royal Horticultural Society Guidelines for Show Judges.

Vegetables must have been grown by the entrant.
The entrant must have owned plants for at least three months before the show day.
Tomatoes and all fruits must have stalks or calyxes attached.

PRIZES

Points will be awarded for each class as follows:

First – 4 points

Second – 3 points

EATON BISHOP TOP TRAY COMPETITION (CLASS 1)

A collection of 5 different vegetables – 2 samples of each vegetable
Vegetables are to be displayed for effect within an area 46cms x 61cms without bending. A board or tray exceeding these dimensions internally may be used or the area may be marked out on the staging. A black base cloth is allowed and the tray may be painted. Only parsley is allowed as a garnish. No other material is allowed. Onion tops may be tied with raffia, carrots and parsnips must have their foliage trimmed back to 8 cms and tomatoes must be shown with calyxes.

SECOND - £10

EATON BISHOP TOP VASE COMPETITION (CLASS 26)

A vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems taken from a minimum of 2 different kinds of plants (not 2 varieties of the same plant). Flowers must be fresh and home grown. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads of berries; no accessories; no additional foliage unattached to flowering stems. Packaging material including oasis can be used to keep the stems in place.

The display will be judged out of 35 points: 25 for colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers and 10 points for overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase. No marks are awarded for the vase.
